Vehicles in the School Carpark

I would like to remind all parents, grandparents or other family members that when dropping off and picking up students, **please do not drive your vehicle into the staff carpark, at any time of the day.** The Department of Education have issued a Safety Alert to all principals to review all access by vehicles onto school grounds.

We understand there are times when a parent or family member needs access to the disabled parking and this will be permitted after approval from the principal.

Parking Around the School – please obey road signage

Already people have been stopping in the bus zone on Cullen Rd after school. Not only is this illegal, it endangers the lives of students in our school who catch the bus home. **We would like to remind parents and family members to obey the road rules surrounding the school to ensure the safety of our community.**

As the safety of our students is one of our primary concerns, staff will take photos of cars parked illegally and these will be passed on to the police to ensure the safety of our students and community. Additionally, the school has contacted local rangers to patrol the school area before school and after school.



Skoolbag app

As some new users may be aware, the school is currently experiencing some issues with the Skoolbag app. At this stage the company is still investigating the cause of the problem and it has been referred to their engineering team.

We hope to have it fixed as soon as possible, but in the meantime we apologise for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience.

Instructions on using Avalon Ave Drop Off and Pick Up:

Drop off– Morning

- Only turn car around in the cul-de-sac
- Only drop children off between the signs marked:

***'no parking 8-9:30am–2:30-4pm
school days'***

- **DO NOT GET OUT OF CAR**

A teacher has been assigned duty to help children get out of the car

DO NOT park your car between the signs 'no parking 8-9:30am–2:30-4pm school days'

This area is a designated drop off zone and is not for parking and walking students onto school grounds.

Pick up– Afternoon

- Join the car queue in Avalon Ave
 - Only turn car around in the cul-de-sac
 - **Do not pick up any children until the teacher on duty arrives to assist**
 - Only pick children up between the signs marked:
- 'no parking 8-9:30am–2:30-4pm school days'***

- **DO NOT GET OUT OF CAR**

A teacher has been assigned duty to help children get into the car.

DO NOT park your car between the signs 'no parking 8-9:30am–2:30-4pm school days'

Ethics Teachers Wanted for 2019

Primary Ethics provides the opportunity for NSW public primary school students who don't attend scripture classes (SRE) to participate in philosophical ethics classes. Classes are on Tuesdays mornings for 30 minutes and teach children how to approach ethical issues and develop their capacity for considered moral judgement, which will enable them to respond more thoughtfully to many of the problems and issues they will face in their lives.

Volunteer Ethics Teachers are trained to deliver age-appropriate curriculum every week and to use the accompanying learning and teaching materials.

School banking

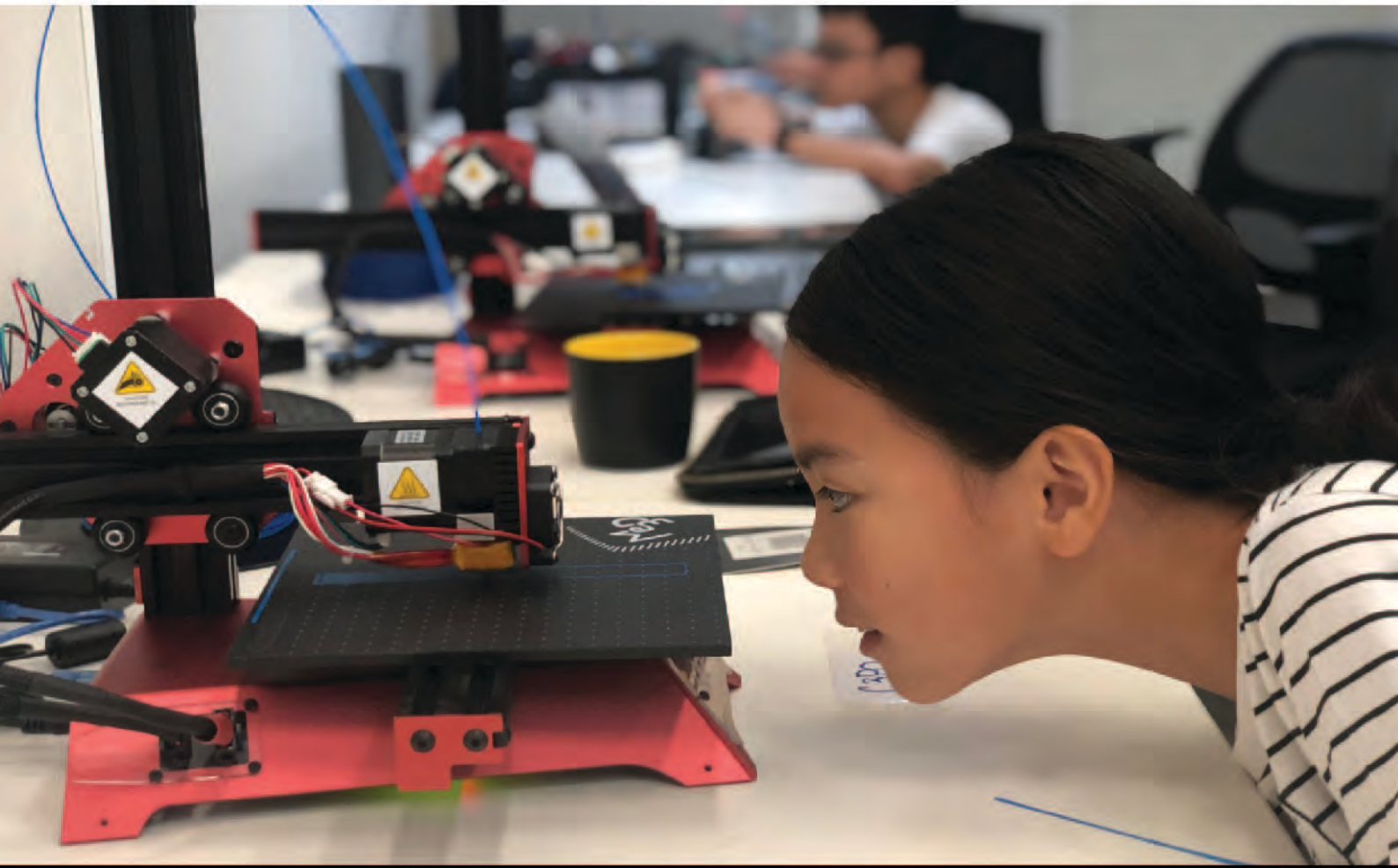
