Principal's Report

Art Auction

Staffing

We are also welcoming Meagan Bartlett to the school who was appointed to the school as a new graduate.

Unfortunately, there are some staff moving on. Mrs Zoe Lee was successful in securing a position at Wentworth Falls Public School, Mrs Samantha Silipo is moving on to Wentworth Point Public School as an AP, Mrs Alix Campbell has received a transfer to Rouse Hill Public School which is much closer to home, Miss Harding has also successfully transferred to Epping Heights Public School. Unfortunately Mandarin will not be taught next year and Miss Shirley Gao will be moving on. I wish all these staff the best for the future and in their new positions.

COVID-19

The Department of Education has released the *Term 1 2021 DRAFT planning guidelines* to school. The school executive will be going through this document to understand what the implications are for Term 1 2021. Once this has been done, communication will be sent to parents outlining the changes that will be implemented in Term 1 2021.

BYOD

Thank you to all the parents that completed the technology survey, regarding the BYOD model for Stage 3, which was sent home earlier this term. Just over 260 parents responded with results showing that 50 % of parents that completed the survey were supportive of the proposal, 25% were not supportive of the proposal and 25% indicated that they were happy leaving the decision to the school.

The feedback from the survey also showed that parents may not have a clear understanding of how technology is integrated into learning. Due to this, the decision has been made to not move ahead with the implementation of BYOD model in 2021. The school will focus on communicating to parents why and how technology is integrated into learning before proposing the shift to the BYOD model.

A huge thank you to the team of parents, led by Kate Talifero, that helped organise and decorate the Year 6 Farewell. Thank you also to all the teachers that attended the evening and helped create a lasting memory for our Year 6 students. Reporting absences

Calling the school

Please use the telephone in case of emergency only. The best way to communicate with a teacher or other member of staff is via a note sent with your child or by sending an email to the school email. Your classroom teacher is the initial point of contact if you have any questions or concerns, but as stated above any urgent matters should be emailed directly to the school.

Keep in mind it is not always possible to get a phone message to your child's class, particularly towards the end of the day. Make sure they know each morning how they are getting home and what they should do if they are feeling uncertain.

Merit Awards

When your child has received five merit awards, they can hand them in at the office to be issued with a Gold award. Once your child has five Gold awards, they then hand them in to receive a Banner. All awards are presented fortnightly. Please take good care of your awards as lost ones will not be reissued!


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


