
Principal's Report

- 3:15pm Clap out begins


Additional RFF

In 2024, teachers will continue to be provided with release time to focus on curriculum reform to help them effectively implement new syllabuses. Teachers will receive an additional 5 hours per term and Assistant Principals will receive an additional 43 hours per term. During this release time, staff will engage in activities that will deepen their understanding of the new syllabus and strengthen teaching and learning practices. This may include engaging in professional learning; collaborating in developing new scope and sequences; designing units of work; and preparing assessment tasks. The additional release time provides teachers with dedicated time to plan and prepare over the period of the reform.

Getting to school by bus in 2024

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a 2024 School Opal cards. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of this year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

School Opal cards

- All students catching the bus in 2024 will need a School Opal card.
- Under the <u>School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)</u>, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the SSTS and how to apply for a School Opal Card, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer, and click 'apply for a school travel pass'.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.
- 5. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 6. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.

Medical Plans, Health Care Plans and Medication

At the commencement of every school year, we require updated medical and/or health care plans for students with asthma, allergies, anaphylaxis or any other diagnosed medical conditions. If you have not returned these plans or provided the office with medications and permission to administer medications, please do so ASAP.

Calling the school

Please use the telephone in case of emergency only. The best way to communicate with a teacher or other member of staff is via a note sent with your child or by sending an email to the school email. Your classroom teacher is the initial point of contact if you have any questions or concerns, but as stated above any urgent matters should be emailed directly to the school.

Keep in mind it is not always possible to get a phone message to your child's class, particularly towards the end of the day. Make sure they know each morning how they are getting home and what they should do if they are feeling uncertain.

Merit Awards

When your child has received five merit awards, they can hand them in at the office to be issued with a Gold award in their next assembly. Once your child has five Gold awards, they then hand them in to receive a Banner. All awards are presented fortnightly. Please do not laminate the merit awards until they have been exchanged for a Gold award.

Please take good care of your awards as lost ones will not be reissued!

Borrowed Clothes

If your child has borrowed clothes from the school, please wash and return them as soon as possible. It is also a good idea to have a spare pair of underpants and long pants or stockings packed in your child's bag in case they have an accident at school.

No Nuts

Please ensure that you do not send any nuts or food containing nuts to school with your child. We have children at the school who could have a potential life threatening allergic reaction. Choose alternative sandwich spreads to peanut butter and Nutella. Inform your child that these foods can trigger an anaphylactic reaction. Please also remind your child not to share food with their friends.

Parent Helpers

If you are volunteering as a parent helper, you first need to fill in a declaration which is kept at the office and present one form of photo ID. This needs to be completed at least a day before you first volunteer. It is necessary to complete this form even if you have a Working With Children Check. This is then valid until your youngest child finishes at the school. You must always sign in when

Please note: You DO NOT need to go to Service NSW to obtain an official Working With Children Check to volunteer as a parent helper.

Assembly Etiquette

We love seeing parents at assembly, but we ask that you follow a few guidelines to assist the school and school community.

Taking Photos of Students at School Events



Great News!



Our Before, After School and Holiday programs are designed to support school communities and busy families. We provide an engaging and educational environment for children to form friendships, learn life skills and prepare them for life beyond the classroom.

Since July 10 2023, families who earn less than \$530,000pa are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy with up to 90% off fees! This means even more families can access quality programs such as our 'Rise then Shine' before school program, 'Stay and Play' after school program, and our Holiday HQ School Holiday programs at a very affordable rate. On average, Australian families get an 86% rebate* on all sessions.

All of our 460+ services across Australia are registered and approved by the Australian Government to ensure parents at our services can access CCS.

What if I don't currently get CCS and want to apply?

If your family earns under \$530,000 and meets the following requirements, you are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

You or your partner must meet all of the following:

- care for your child at least 2 nights per fortnight, or have 14% care
- are liable for fees for care provided at an approved child care service. Every centre we run across Australia is registered and approved by the Australian Government
- · meet the residence rules.

Your child must also meet both of these:

- immunisation requirements
- not be attending secondary school unless an exemption applies.

How much can I get?

The Child Care Subsidy amount you're eligible for will be based on the following:

- your family's income
- the hourly rate cap based on the type of approved child care you use and your child's age
- the hours of activity you and your partner do
- the number of children in your care. The amount of subsidised childcare you can access per fortnight applies to each child.

You can use this Payment and Service Finder to estimate how much Child Care Subsidy (CCS) you may get.

How do I make a claim?

You need to set aside about 30 minutes to do the following:

- 1. Create a MyGov account and link it to Centrelink. If you've claimed a payment before, you can use your Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) to link Centrelink to myGov.
- 2. Provide your identity. You can do this by providing one document from each of the following lists:
 - Australian birth certificate, Australian citizenship certificate, Australian passport, Australian Visa
 - Australian driver license, Australian Certificate of Registration by Descent, ImmiCard
 - You may also need to enter some details from your Medicare card.
- 3. As you complete your claim, you may asked for certain documents or information. These will show as required in your claim. Documents may include:
 - Tax File Number, child's birth certificate, financial records, employment details (payslip) Health Card, relationship status, residence details if you have lived outside of Australia.
- 4. Confirm your enrolment by asking your childcare service for your enrolment details then confirm them by using your Centrelink online account through myGov. Select Family from the menu, followed by Child Care then Enrolments.

For help, use this online guide to confirm your child's enrolment details

What happens next?

Once your claim has been processed you will receive an Assessment Notice either by regular mail or via your MyGov Inbox.

The Assessment Notice will inform you of the following:

- if you're eligible
- the childcare fee assistance you'll receive
- the annual cap that applies to you
- the withholding amount.

If you are eligible, the payment will be automatically applied to the fees billed by your childcare service. You don't have to do anything else.

It is your responsibility to then keep your information up to date. You can do this by regularly checking your details are correct in MyGov and tell them if:

- your family's income changes
- your or your partner's activity levels change
- your relationship status changes
- there are any other changes to your or your partner's circumstances.

Your information about your family circumstances needs to be accurate so you receive the correct amount of CCS.


